Rebate Application Instructions, Terms and Conditions

For Municipal and Co-Op Electric Customers

For Systems Purchased on or after April 1, 2010



Instructions: Please read the program instructions, terms and conditions before completing the form on the other page.

A. CUSTOMERS — TO QUALIFY FOR YOUR REBATE, YOU MUST

1. Purchase, install and operate a high-efficiency central air conditioner, heat pump, ductless mini-split or geothermal unit in a residence that is currently supplied by a municipal or co-op electric company (not Atlantic City Electric, Jersey Central Power & Light, PSE&G or Rockland Electric Company).
2. Replace an installation in an existing New Jersey home.
3. High-efficiency electric central air conditioner, heat pump, ductless mini-split or geothermal unit must meet the efficiency levels in the table below. Both the condenser and coil must be replaced and installed as a matched set.
4. To qualify for a central air conditioner, heat pump or geothermal rebate, the installing HVAC contractor must do the following:
 - 1) Size the high-efficiency equipment within 15% or a half ton of the calculated cooling load "Manual J calculation" or equivalent and
 - 2) Meet "Manual S" system selection criteria. This is not required for ductless mini-split units.
5. Abide by the rules and rebate levels in effect at the date of purchase.
6. **Postmark the application within 60 days of purchase date.**

Geothermal Heat Pump +	GSHP systems must be ENERGY STAR® qualified+ to be eligible for incentives.	ACCA Manual J and Manual S outputs are required showing that the installed system is sized within 15% variance of requirement and correctly selected for the dwelling.	\$400

1. Keep copies of all above required documents. If contractor is submitting the rebate documents for you, we suggest you request your set of copies to be mailed to you simultaneously.
2. If you are applying for more than one rebate, separate rebate forms are to be completed for each individual unit.

C. IMPORTANT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Funding for this rebate program is provided through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA). Due to the federal source of funds, applicants will be subject to special ARRA terms and conditions as described in this document.
2. Due to the limited availability of funds, the program will terminate at the earlier of when funds are exhausted or December 31, 2010. Program termination will be posted on NJCleanEnergy.com.
3. Applications or supporting documentation received after the program termination date will not be honored.
4. Program procedures, requirements and rebate levels are subject to change or cancellation without notice.
5. It is the responsibility of the customer to assure that all requirements for the rebate are met and that all required documentation is provided.
6. If the customer portion of the rebate is to be assigned to another party, the customer must authorize this by completing and signing section B of the application form.
7. Failure to provide any of the required information will prevent processing of your application.
8. Please allow up to 120 days from the date *New Jersey's Clean Energy Program* receives **all required information** to process your rebate.
9. *New Jersey's Clean Energy Program* reserves the right to inspect all installations in order to ensure compliance with all program requirements.
10. Incentives are available for the installation (replacement) of qualified HVAC equipment in all existing residential buildings.
11. *New Jersey's Clean Energy Program* provides no oversight or control over any contractor services related to this program. Responsibility for proper installation, as well as delivery and workmanship related to any equipment or services the customer procures, rests exclusively with the contractor selected by the customer. *New Jersey's Clean Energy Program* assumes no responsibility for oversight of contractor services.
12. Only one rebate will be issued to each customer for each appliance type.
13. *New Jersey's Clean Energy Program* audits its rebate programs as a protection against consumer and/or contractor fraud. Any attempt to defraud *New Jersey's Clean Energy Program* will result in automatic rejection of the rebate application and possible legal action.
14. Installations must be completed in accordance with all laws, codes and other requirements applicable under federal, state, and local authority.
15. You are urged to seek appropriate consultation concerning both tax liabilities that might be associated with the receipt of the rebate and any Federal tax credits available.
16. Customers participating in other programs within *New Jersey's Clean Energy Programs* or New Jersey Weatherization Assistance Programs may not be eligible for rebates.
17. Installations of equipment in new homes are not eligible for incentives.
18. To expedite the processing of your application, please provide the CEE- AHRI reference# for installed matched system.
