

## What is the Alternative Fuel Infrastructure Program?

- This program provides cost-share funding to local government agencies to offset the costs of purchasing and installing refueling and recharging stations for non-petroleum alternative fuels.
- Infrastructure for the following alternative fuels is eligible:
  - natural gas
  - propane
  - electricity
  - ethanol (E85) and
  - hydrogen

## Why Should You Consider Using Alternative Fuels?

- Alternative fuels are generally cleaner-burning than traditional fuels such as gasoline and diesel. Using alternative fuels helps improve our air quality.
- By using alternative fuels, you'll be helping to reduce our country's reliance on imported oil.

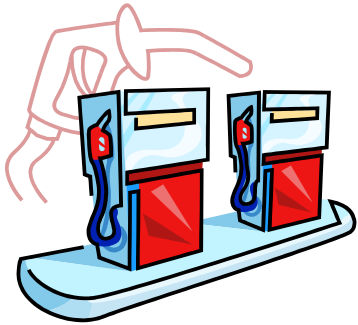

## Who is Eligible to Apply for the Alternative Fuel Infrastructure Program?

- Municipalities
- Counties
- Boards of Education
- State Colleges and Universities
- Governmental authorities
- Other local government agencies



## How Much Funding is Available?

- Total program funding is \$500,000.
- Participants will receive a rebate for 50% of eligible costs, up to a maximum rebate of \$50,000 per applicant.

## How Does the Alternative Fuel Infrastructure Program Work?

- Eligible applicants should contact the Board of Public Utilities, Office of Clean Energy about participating in the program, and complete a program application.
- Rebate applications will be evaluated on a first-come, first-served basis, as long as funding is available.
- All funding is provided as a reimbursement, after the refueling or recharging equipment has been purchased and installed.

The program is funded by \$500,000 in Petroleum Overcharge Reimbursement Funds (PORF) administered by the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities.
